# Purpose of survey

This is the first survey we have undertaken since receiving the 'jobs for nature' funding from LINZ in March 2021

We will be undertaking biannual surveys over the next four years to monitor community satisfaction and aspirations for Lake Dunstan.

This survey creates a baseline upon which the Trust and its stakeholders can build upon.



Percentage of Cromwell Basin population: 2.8%








# Q3: Maintaining a healthy natural environment is important to me











# Additional comments: 26% gave more information

"I would like to see more swimming only areas created. A swim across the lake challenge each year. BBQ areas outside of town for people to enjoy the whole lake"

"We need stronger action to hold Contact Energy and the councils to account for their action or lack of action in most cases." "The lake is a fantastic asset for the community. It would be a huge shame for it to become unusable & become a visual eyesore due to increasing weed, silt build up & driftwood. Boat ramps around the lake need to be maintained better. particularly to ensure these remain usable."

"Toilets & better campground"

"The lake is such an important part of our community and a strong draw for tourists during the summer. If more areas of the lake shore were cleared and easy to access it would mean more space available for people to enjoy."

"Keep up the good work LDCT & know that your community is behind you!"

"Opening up the lake foreshore by removing willows and exotic species and replanting in natives would be a great way to showcase the lake and showcase its beauty."

## **Additional comments: Kawarau Arm focussed**

"Old Cromwell town needs to wake up to the stinking cess pit that they will be looking at"

"Fix the lake in old Cromwell. Dredge it or do something so we can use it"

"People would have been less upset by Kawarau Arm siltation if they had known all along this was inevitable. I don't understand why no-one knew/was told before now. Very strange." "The Kawarau arm in particular needs most of the weed and silt removed to create swimming and boating beaches."

"Please plant the new silt beds in the Kawarau Arm of Lake Dunstan to native species or they will be filled by willows and other non natives. Once the willows get established, nobody will be able to see or access the river." "I'd love to see an artist vision for how the kawarau arm might look after it has transitioned back to a river. This would help everyone imagine the possibilities and work towards it."

"What was envisaged 30 years ago for the Kawaura arm is no longer applicable. A detailed plan needs to be done to look at options. Contact are not being responsible .I look forward to more visible protests on the Lake."

# Conclusion

- Most of the negative opinions are on the impacts of the silt & weed on the visual amenity, recreational use and safety of the lake.
- The Kawarau arm is the main concern for participants of the survey
- Community are keen to have more opportunities to utilise the lake but without increase commercial activities to the level found on Lake Wakatipu and Wanaka
- There needs to be more communication on the issues/aspects of the lake so the community are more aware LDCT, LINZ, Contact Energy & Council all need to address this lack of communication.
- There is a good relationship with LDCT & the community but we can work to improve it further

# **Future Surveys**

- This was a pilot survey to see how we progress and level of community participation/interest.
- We need to get a higher percentage of the community to participate ideally 40% minimum. We therefore need to do more research into how we can achieve this.
- The topic of future surveys will be focused on the various aspects of the waterways & on our project as it progresses.
- We want to ensure everyone in the community has the opportunity to voice their opinions in our surveys to ensure development is community led
